It was with a sigh of satisfaction that we gathered each afternoon and evening to relax, enjoy a movie, and share a meal.

In June we look forward to our Texas State Roundup in Glen Rose. Then in July we will camp together again, hopefully in Stonewall Texas. We are not sure if they are accepting campers yet and we may have to make other plans. But we are definitely going to get together in July. If any want to join us, just give us a call when it gets closer to July, and we'll fill you in on our plans. We are in the midst of putting together a suitcase of dolls and wooden trucks to send with a local church's mission team heading to Panama in August. So we'll be painting trucks and dressing dolls while we are together.

Chapter 19 is very much a family group, as I'm sure most of our groups are. We enjoy being together, sharing joys, sorrows, aches and pains, and news of our respective families. 
