Planning for the national rally to be held the end of September is in full swing. Below I have attached a picture of the design to be on the front of the shirts and a copy of the registration form. Here is some information you may or may not know about the rally.

When: official dates are September 28, leaving on October 2.

Where: Bullard, TX (south of Tyler), Bushman's RV 903-894-8221

How much: Registration fee-\$25, T-shirts-\$23, Polo-\$28, catered meal-\$16, and site (arrange with park) \$35.70/night.

Mission: With the executive board hosting we have selected a local Bullard Mission. Bullard Mission House and Mission Clinic was started in 2004 by Hazel Mason as a mission project of First United Methodist Church in Bullard. They fully rely on God to meet all their needs. They have four volunteer doctors and four or more volunteer nurses that provide care

through the clinic. Over the years they have grown to occupy a five thousand square foot building to meet their needs. They have a food pantry, clothes closet and meet seasonal needs - school supplies and Christmas. We will be collecting an offering when Hazel Mason comes to speak to us. If you feel led to donate clothing any size infant to adult, or canned goods, feel free to do so. All donations are very much appreciated.

We are trying to make it simple, so we will not be having special entertainment. This is the weekend (Friday recommended) for Canton's "First Monday" and we are close to Tyler and Jackson. Most of all we want to just get together with near and far friends-talk, roam around, and play games. We will have a few contests.

You still have time to register, but the park will be releasing some of our sites as we get closer to the date.
